## **Color by Number**


Use the following guide to color in the picture below. Of course, you can change any of the colors, but make sure you color each of the areas that have the same number with the same color.

1: grey, 2: skin tone, 3: blue, 4: green, 5: dark green, 6: brown, 7: yellow, 8: light grey











A flower (6 pieces)

A candle (all 7 pieces)


### Find the Differences



### More Fun for Shavuot


I'm excited to share this new original card game I made for *Shavuot*, but it can be played year round. It's for 1-4 players, it's best for ages 8 and up, and it's available for download on my website: thatjewishmoment.com.

It's based on the popular custom many have to stay awake all night, on the first night of *Shavuot*. The game is made of 2 phases: during the prep phase, players prepare their hands with various tools to help them stay awake (ex: caffeine, a cool breeze). Then, during the night phase, players find out who's ready to pull an all-nighter.

- 1. The tent had 4 doors or 2 (two opinions, BeReishit Rabbah 48:9, as understood by Eitz Yosef).
- 2. One opinion is the visit took place on *Pesach* and one is that it was on *Sukkot* (*BeReishit Rabbah* 48:12 and *Rosh HaShana* 11a).
- 3. The three guests/angels were all dressed in Arabic clothes or one was dressed as a baker, one as a ship captain, and one in Arabic clothes (*Bava Metzia* 86b and *BeReishit Rabbah* 48:9).
- 4. The guests had three cattle or four (Bava Metzia 86b and Tanchuma in VaYeira 4).
- 5. Sarah baked 9 se'ah of flour or 3 se'ah of flour (two opinions in BeReishit Rabbah 48:12).
